Cookie Policy (EU)

This cookie statement was last updated on 29 August 2022 and applies to citizens of the European Economic Area.

1. Introduction

Our website, <http://www.erc.ie> (hereinafter: "the website") uses cookies and other related technologies (for convenience all technologies are referred to as "cookies"). Cookies are also placed by third parties we have engaged. In the document below we inform you about the use of cookies on our website.

2. What are cookies?

A cookie is a small simple file that is sent along with pages of this website and stored by your browser on the hard drive of your computer or another device. The information stored therein may be returned to our servers or to the servers of the relevant third parties during a subsequent visit.

3. Consent

When you visit our website for the first time, we will show you a pop-up with an explanation about cookies. As soon as you click on "Save preferences", you consent to us using the categories of cookies and plug-ins you selected in the pop-up, as described in this Cookie Policy. You can disable the use of cookies via your browser, but please note that our website may no longer work properly.

4. Cookies

4.1 Strictly necessary cookies

Some cookies ensure that certain parts of the website work properly. Strictly necessary cookies allow these parts of the website to function. However, strictly necessary cookies are only used in the delivery of services that have been explicitly requested by the users of the website and only contain information necessary to provide these services. Some examples of these cases are tracking items placed in an online shopping basket or if the website user explicitly requests to use a chatbot function. In such cases, we may place a cookie without your consent. Cookies related to advertising are not strictly necessary and must be consented to.

4.2 Social media buttons

On our website we have included buttons for Twitter to promote webpages (e.g. “like”, “pin”) or share (e.g. “tweet”) on social networks like Twitter. These buttons work using pieces of code coming from Twitter themselves. This code places cookies. These social media buttons also can store and process certain information, so a personalized advertisement can be shown to you.

Please read the privacy statement of Twitter (which can change regularly) to read what it does with your (personal) data which it processes using these cookies. The data that is retrieved is anonymised as much as possible. Twitter is located in the United States.

6. Your rights with respect to personal data

You have the following rights with respect to your personal data:
