


Students in DEIS schools had access to **fewer books** at home than students in non-DEIS schools.




Hindrances to learning at school

Students in DEIS schools placed **lower value** on schooling.

Overall, **boys** placed **less value** on schooling than **girls**.



Hindrances to learning identified by principals



Further and higher education

At least one parent with a **degree-level qualification**



Students who expect to complete a **bachelors or post-grad degree**



Parental involvement and support

Students in DEIS schools had a **significantly lower mean score** than students in non-DEIS schools on the index of **parental support for learning at home**.



Students in DEIS schools had a **significantly higher mean score** on the index of school policies for **parental involvement**



Parents' **emotional support** did not differ between DEIS and non-DEIS schools.
